David = Nathan (prophet) 7:2

David becomes King of Judah. 2:4  
adds all Israel. 5:3 → Jerusalem became capital  
of the united Kingdom

David's adultery w/ Bathsheba is reckoned w/ story of rich man/poor man

Abner, Joab + Benaiah = military commanders

Absalom = led a revolt against King David

# 1 Kings

Hiram was most closely associated w/ Tyre, 5:10

King Ahab confiscated Naboth's vineyard 21:18  
↳ death predicted by Micahiah 22:19-28

Solomon - Asked God for an understanding mind to govern your people. 3:9

1st King of N. Kingdom (Israel), whose sins were repeated <sup>by every</sup> King? Jeroboam

Elijah tells God to "take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors," 19:4

2 Kings

Jehu = Assassinated Jezebel + her offspring. 9-10

Josiah = King, religious reform + reintro. <sup>22+23</sup> back of the law

## 1 Chronicles

Saul is condemned for seeking guidance from a medium. 10:13

David is not allowed to build a temple. 22:8

2 Chronicles

Ezra

Decree of Cyrus regarding reconstruction of the  
Jerusalem Temple. 1:1-4

Nehemiah

Greatest achievement = Rebuilt the wall of Jerusalem

# Esther

Vashti - queen disowned <sup>respond to his</sup> b/c would not serve King <sup>own for her</sup>

Haman becomes furious w/ Mordecai <sup>3:2</sup> b/c he won't bow for Haman.

The girl (maiden) who pleases the King most will  
be his queen.

Elihu - young friend  
end of story

Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar - Job's friends

"The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord" 1:21

Keziah

Keren-happuch

→ received an inheritance from Job  
42:14-15

At the end of <sup>Book of</sup> Job, God is angry with Job's friends.

Job's wife - tells Job to curse God and die.

Psalm 91 = power/protection of God

The birth of a child prophecy 7:14

The "Immanuel" sign 7:14

Ahaz's response to God's demand for him to ask for a sign

"deep as Sheol or high as heaven" is to refuse to ask for a sign. 7

Predicted that Sennacherib, King of Assyria, would die by the sword  
in his own land. (came true) 37:7, 37-38

"Behold, my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my  
soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him, he will bring  
forth justice to the nations." 42

"He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows  
and acquainted w/ grief" 53:3

Eyes of blind shall be opened, ears of the deaf unstopped. 35:5

"He was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for  
our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that  
made us whole, and w/ his bruises we were healed." 53:5

Truly I do not know how to speak, for I'm only a boy. 1:6

"Is there no balm in Gilead?" 20:14

"Cursed by the day on which I was born." 8:22

"Why does the way of the guilty prosper?" 12:1

Zedekiah (King) = brought J. from dungeon to ask "if there any word from the Lord?" 37:16-17

# Lamentations

Ezekiel

Daniel

And many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth  
shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to  
shame and contempt 12:2

## Hosea

Develops main themes in imagery of marriage between God + Israel. 2

"When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son." 11:1

For they sow the wind, and they shall reap the whirlwind.

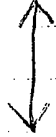
Took a prostitute as his wife.

— Named children "Not pitied" and "Not my people" @ birth as signs of his message from God to Israel 1:6-9

"How can I give you up, Ephraim? ~~How~~ How can I hand you over, O Israel? ... My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender." 11:8

## Joel

Joel spoke the words cited in Acts 2, "...I will pour out my spirit on <sup>all flesh,</sup> 2:28



Your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your old men... 2:28

"I will show portents in the heavens and on the earth, blood and fire and columns of smoke." 2:30

## Amos

Identified himself as from "among the shepherds" 1:1

Criticized Israel's wealthy folk 2:1-11

- "Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an everlasting stream." 5:24

- "Hear this, you who trample upon the needy, and bring the poor of the land to an end, saying, 'When will the new moon be over, ... that we may buy <sup>the poor</sup> for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, and sell the refuse of the wheat?'"

## Obadiah

Most prophecies concerned the sins of Edom.

## Jonah

Justified his behavior saying, "... I knew you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger, + abounding in steadfast love, and repentest of evil," 4:2

\* Isaiah, Joel + Micah = "plowshares" "spears"  
2:4 3:10 4:3 "swords" "pruning hooks"

## Micah

4:1-2 2:2-4  
Micah + Isaiah proclaimed future where "the house of the Lord will be est.  
as highest of mountains, people shall flow to it, many nations shall come."

"...and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice,  
love kindness, and walk humbly w/ your God" 6:8

Contains: Samaria + Jerusalem will fall 1:6  
Zion will be restored 4:6-13  
a Ruler will come from Bethlehem 5:2

"But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, ... from you shall  
come forth for me one who is to rule Israel." 5:2

## Nahum

Focuses almost exclusively upon fall of Ninevah.

## Habakkuk

"I will take my stand to watch, + station myself on the tower,  
and look forth to see what he will say to me, and what I  
will answer concerning my complaint." 2:1

"...but the righteous shall live by <sup>their</sup> ~~his~~ faith." 2:4

"...the earth will be filled w/ the knowledge of the  
glory of the Lord."

"...in wrath, may you remember mercy." 3:2

## Zephaniah

Major them: Imminent approach of "the great day of the Lord."

Haggai

Prophet during reign of  
King Darius

When some of the people exiled to Babylon returned to  
Jerusalem during the Persian period, Haggai urged them  
to rebuild the temple. 1:7-9

Zechariah



Donkey → zebra → Z

<sup>12</sup>Lo, your King comes to you; triumphant and victorious  
is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt,  
the foal of a donkey." 9:9

## Malachi

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight." 3:1

Only miracle in all four gospels? Feeding the multitudes  
Matt 14:31, Mark 6, Luke 9, John 6

Parable of the sower - not in John

Matthew - tax collector (9:9)

Sermon on the (M)ount Ch. 5+6 ( salt of the earth light of the world  
lilies of the field )

The Lord's Prayer Ch. 6 (also in Luke 11:4)

Peter, James, + John were w/ Jesus @ transfiguration. 17:1  
- Moses + Elijah talked w/ Jesus while he was transfigured

Jesus was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane. 26:50

You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church. 16:18

## Mark

Reports the young man fleeing from the arrest of Jesus. 14:51-52

The Gerasene demoniac lived in the tombs. 5:3

"The unclean spirits... fell down before him and shouted, "You are the Son of God!" But he sternly ordered them not to make him known."

Conclusion of Mark's gospel incl: They said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Truly this man was a Son of God. - Roman centurion 15:39

Luke

Intention = to present an orderly account

Jesus' birth include poems.

Circumcision + presentation @ temple

After Jesus preached in Nazareth synagogue → put out of the city. 4:29

- He read from Isaiah "the Spirit of the Lord is upon me." 4:18

"Behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, began to wet his feet w/ her tears." 7:38

Parable of the two sons and the lost coin. 15

Pharisee prayed "God, I thank thee that I am not like other men!" 18:11

Lazarus = upon dying, was carried away by angels to be  
w/ Abraham

Emmalls

Centurion → Certainly this man was innocent.

John Last verse = Jesus did so many things, the world could not contain all the books reporting them. 21:25

Pilate asks Jesus "What is truth?" 18:38

Jesus says to Pilate "You say that I am a King. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth." 18:37

Jesus' friend, Lazarus, was from Bethany. 11:1 So?

John the Baptist = a man sent from God 1:6

Jesus said the man had been blind so the works of God could be seen in him. 9:1-3

Ch. 10 = Jesus as the Good Shepherd

Role of Paraclete or Advocate. 14:16-17, 26; 15:26; 16:7-11

Inscription on Jesus' cross = Pilate "what I have written, I have written" 19:19-22

Jesus  
Drives money changers out of the temple

Water and blood flow from Jesus' body 1:1-21

## Acts

"I have no silver or gold, but I give you what I have" 3:6 =  
Peter to the lame man @ Beautiful Gate of the Temple

Peter + John's defense <sup>@ their trial</sup> for healing the lame man = <sup>he was healed by the name</sup> of Jesus Christ 4:10

After conversation w/ Ethiopian Eunuch, Philip baptized him. 8:38

Idol makers of the Temple of <sup>Ephesus</sup> Artemis rioted. 19:28

Peter's accusation to Ananias + Saphira (sold property but kept back <sup>5:4</sup>  
some of the proceeds even though they said they gave it all) → lied to God

Acts 10 Peter's visit to Cornelius in Cesarea = Gentiles recvy word of God  
- residents of Lystra thought Barnabus = Zeus + Paul = Hermes → <sup>to re their clothes</sup> + gave speech

Antioch = where disciples were 1<sup>st</sup> called Christians 11:26

Patriarchs + Exodus = Stephens words before the council  
rehearse this part of Israel's history

Paul's situation @ end of Acts → under house arrest in Rome

Acts 15 = gathering to debate circumcision + salvation

6 = wages of sin ~~is~~ death

8 = all things wk together for y:2.8

9 = election

## Romans

"A Jew is one who is <sup>one</sup> inwardly, and real circumcision is a matter of the heart, spiritual and not literal." 2:29

"Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound?" 6:1

Romans 8 = We know that in everything God works for good w/ those who love him, who are called according to his purpose." 8:28

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." 6:23

"...has God rejected his people? By no means!" 11:1

\* "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil w/ good." 12:21

## 1 Corinthians

"Do this in remembrance of me" 11:24

"I would rather speak 5 words w/ my mind, in order to instruct others, than 10,000 words in a tongue." 14:19

— Those who speak in a tongue should pray for the power to interpret. 14:13

"If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body." 15:44

Paul counsels believers not to marry if not already married. 7:8

## 2 Corinthians

Paul besought God 3x to remove his thorn in the flesh →  
God's answer "My grace is sufficient for you." 12:9

B/c Corinthians had been reconciled to God thru Christ  
and given the ministry of reconciliation, they were to  
consider themselves ambassadors of Christ.

Believers are the aroma of Christ to God among those  
who are being saved and among those who are  
perishing; to the one a fragrance of death to death,  
to the other a fragrance of life to life. 2:14-16

Painful visit to this congregation, wrote letter out of  
much distress and anguish of heart and w/  
many tears. 2:1-4

If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation;  
everything old has passed away; see, everything  
has become new! All this is from God, who  
reconciled us to himself through Christ. 5:17-18

Galatians

Freedom

Major theme: Circumcision <sup>not nec. mark of</sup> ≠ Christian identity

Adoption

"For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision is of any avail, but faith working thru love." 5:6

"But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that they might receive adoption as children." 4:4-5

Ephesians Major theme: Unity in Christ

God's ultimate plan for the fullness of time is to  
unite all things to Christ. 1:9-10

Quotes Genesis "For this reason a man shall leave his  
father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the  
two shall become one flesh." 5:31 unity of husband +  
wife

Put on the whole armor of God, so that you will  
be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 6:11
